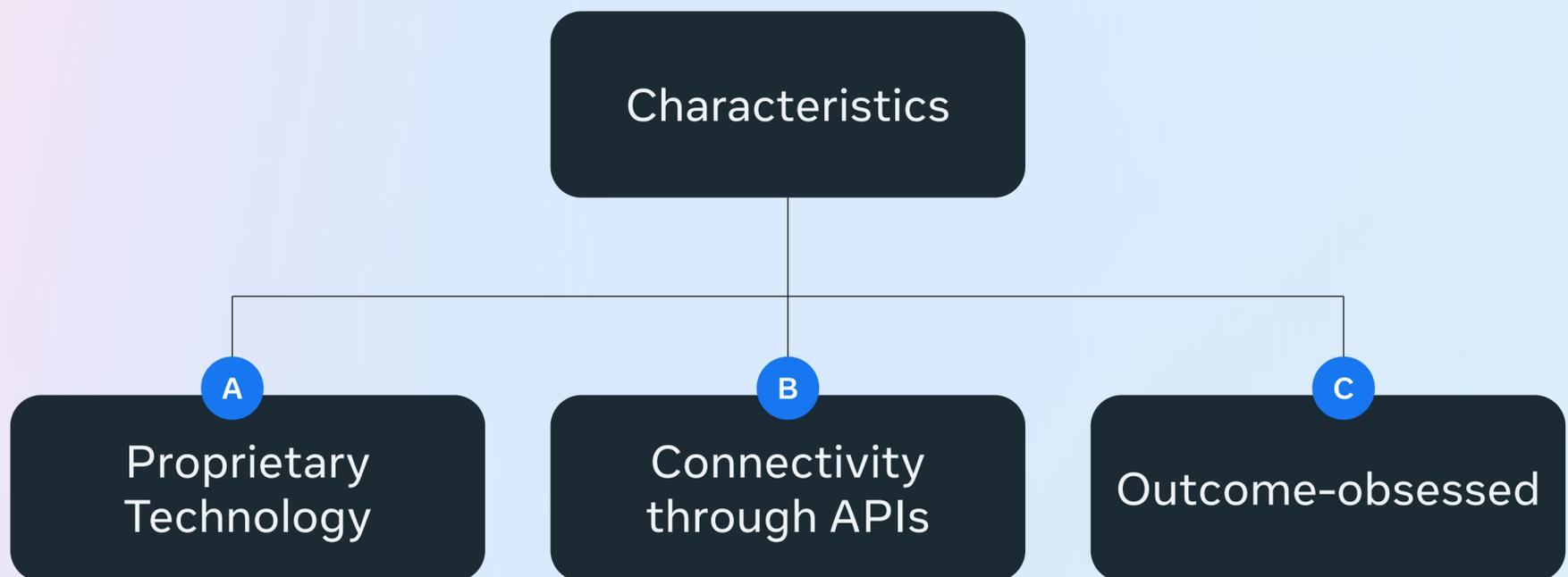
The Agency Business from Disruption to Emergence

I. The DNA of the New Wave of Agency

The defining characteristic of these emerging agencies is their foundational integration with technology. Rather than adopt technology as an add-on, these agencies are "born from technology," with digital innovation embedded in their very DNA. We will explore three of these characteristics:



A. Proprietary technology: Beyond Service to Products & Platforms

One of the most significant differentiators of this new breed of agencies is the development of proprietary technology. They are often building their own tools to solve specific client needs rather than repurpose existing tools. This can take two primary forms:



1. Comprehensive, End-to-End Platforms

Some agencies have developed holistic platforms that businesses can use to manage and execute entire campaigns. An excellent example is Maino AI, an agency from India, who created an end-to-end AI platform on top of Meta Advertising APIs that clients can access, covering real time insights generation, media buying & optimization, and creative analytics & generation. This level of integration provides clients with a streamlined solution, reducing the need to juggle multiple platforms. The platform leverages machine learning and artificial intelligence to automate processes, optimize performance, and ensures the most efficient ROI on every \$ spent.

Sparro by Brainlabs, an agency from Australia, has developed an application that leverages proprietary insights to enhance customer lifetime value (LTV). This allows them to address specific business issues with highly effective, technology-driven solutions. By focusing on a particular area, these agencies can build expertise and develop customized solutions and features that outperform generic tools.

“We created our LTV product as a way of differentiating our agency and being able to back that difference with results. Many of our clients don’t simply want a high volume of sales, they want higher profitability and higher lifetime value. Already we have seen that clients who have used LTV products have achieved 42% reduction in cost per acquisition, +16% Incremental revenue, -29% cost per click, +100% return on ads spend, +19% click through rate and -16% CPM compared to other audience methodologies.”

It allows agencies to control their intellectual property, differentiate themselves in a crowded market, and, most importantly, deliver unique value propositions to clients that cannot be easily replicated by competitors relying on off-the-shelf software. It also fosters a culture of innovation, as the agency constantly refines and enhances its own tools based on real-world client feedback and evolving market demands.

B. Connectivity Through APIs: The Power of Integration

A critical enabler of these proprietary platforms is deep integration with external systems, particularly with major technology platforms like Meta, via Application Programming Interfaces (APIs). This deep integration is not just about convenience; it's about unlocking advanced capabilities:



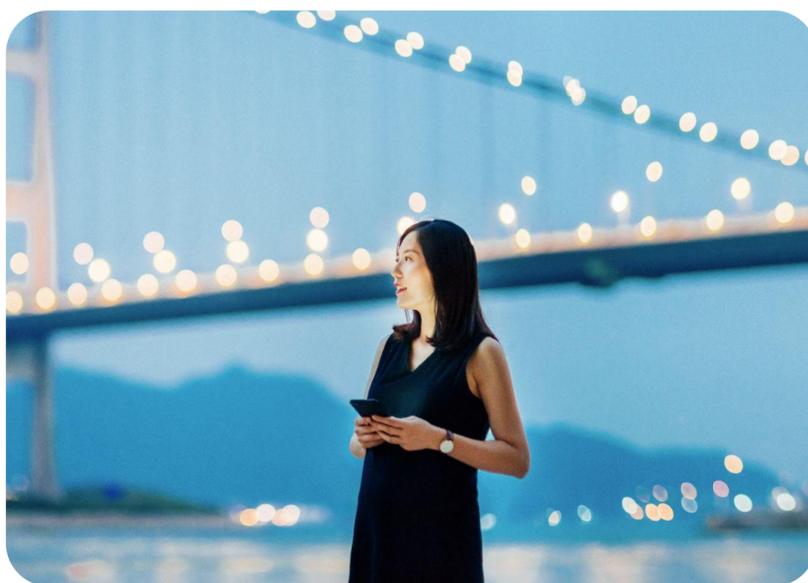
1. Advanced Process Automation

API integration allows for seamless data flow and automated workflows. This means tasks that were once manual and time-consuming, such as campaign setup, budget allocation, bid adjustments, and reporting, can now be executed with speed and precision. This automation enables scale and frees up human talent to focus on higher-value activities like strategy, creative development, and client relationship management. It also reduces the potential for human error, leading to more consistent and effective campaign execution.



2. Optimal Data Utilization

By integrating directly with platform APIs, these agencies gain better access to data than what is typically available through standard interfaces. This enables more sophisticated analytics, predictive modeling, and real-time optimization. Furthermore it enables agencies to blend and aggregate different datasets making insights more holistic and actionable.



The ability to seamlessly connect with and extract value from disparate data sources is a cornerstone of the emerging wave of agency. It allows them to act as central nervous systems for their clients' marketing efforts, orchestrating complex campaigns and providing a unified view of performance.

C. Outcome-Obsessed: From Service Provider to Growth Partner

The genesis of many of these emerging agencies lies in servicing digital-first businesses, such as e-commerce brands and Direct-to-Consumer (D2C) companies. This origin story has instilled a fundamental characteristic: an obsession with measurable outcomes.



1. Results-Driven from Day One

These new agencies are laser-focused on delivering tangible business results from the outset. For e-commerce clients, this means sales, return on ad spend, customer acquisition cost, and customer lifetime value. This intrinsic focus on ROI permeates their culture, decision-making, and service delivery.



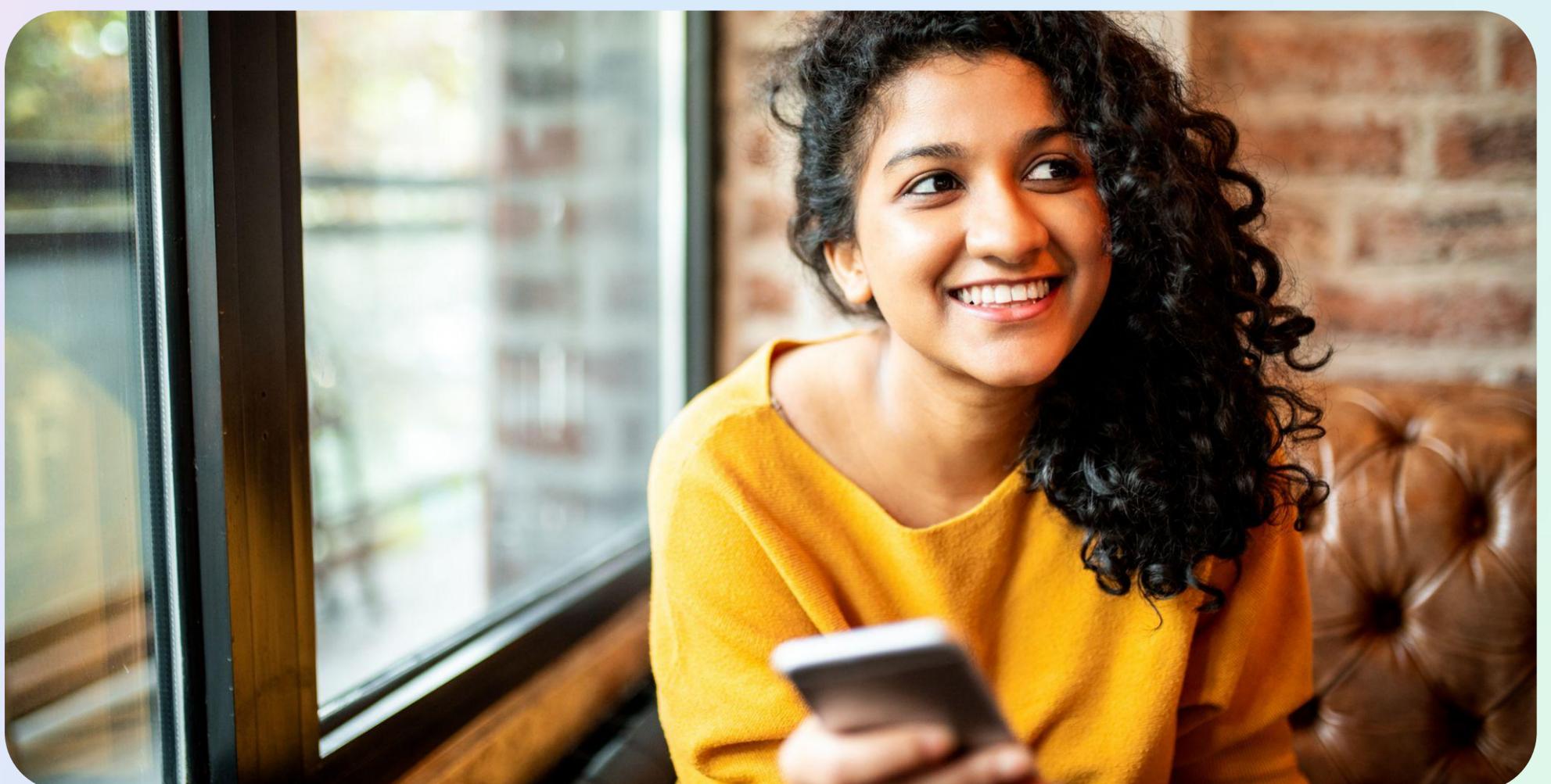
2. Culture of Growth

This outcome-driven mindset fosters a culture of business growth. Agencies are not just service providers; they position themselves as growth partners, intimately tied to the day-to-day success of their clients' businesses. This often translates into more transparent reporting, a willingness to iterate and pivot based on what drives incremental growth, and a shared sense of responsibility for achieving agreed-upon key performance indicators (KPIs).



II. A New Wave of Growth Drivers

Beyond their foundational characteristics, this new wave of agencies demonstrate abilities & capabilities to drive growth for both the agency and the clients they serve. Three common growth drivers will be explored.



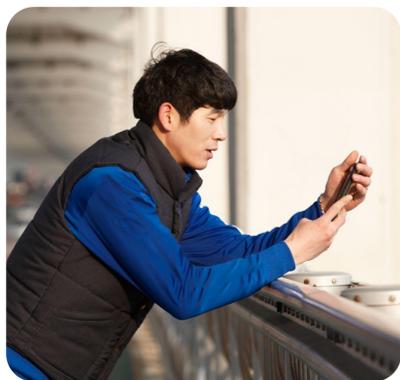
A. New Business Models: Aligning Incentives for Success

The emphasis on technology and results has paved the way for innovative business models that move beyond traditional hourly rates or percentage-of-media-spend compensation. These new models align agency incentives directly with client success:



1. Technology Subscriptions

Given their investment in proprietary platforms, many agencies offer technology subscriptions as a core component of their service. This provides clients with ongoing access to advanced tools and features, often at a predictable monthly or annual cost. This model creates a recurring revenue stream for the agency and offers clients consistent value, fostering long-term relationships based on continuous platform improvement and support.



2. Performance-Based Compensation

Perhaps the most radical departure is the adoption of performance-based compensation models.

Companies like Shopdeck from India operate on an "outcome-oriented business model," where their fees are tied to achieving specific client business results (e.g., revenue). This model dramatically shifts the risk and reward dynamic, creating a true partnership where the companies financial success is directly linked to the client's growth. It demonstrates a high level of confidence in their ability to deliver and provides a strong incentive for constant optimization and innovation. This also forces agencies to be highly efficient and effective, as their profitability is directly tied to the tangible results they produce.

“Our clients want revenue and growth. They don’t want software. Our outcome oriented business model has proven to be very popular. Crucially, this also unlocks the long-tail SMB market: merchants who couldn’t afford traditional agency retainers plus variable fees can now participate on outcome terms, competing on equal footing with larger brands. We have onboarded 3000 clients with >90% of them selling online for the first time. 60% of our clients have had a YOY GMV growth of > 100%.”

These innovative business models represent a paradigm shift. They move away from the "time and materials" approach, which can sometimes incentivize inefficiency, towards a "value-based" approach, which incentivizes performance and shared growth.

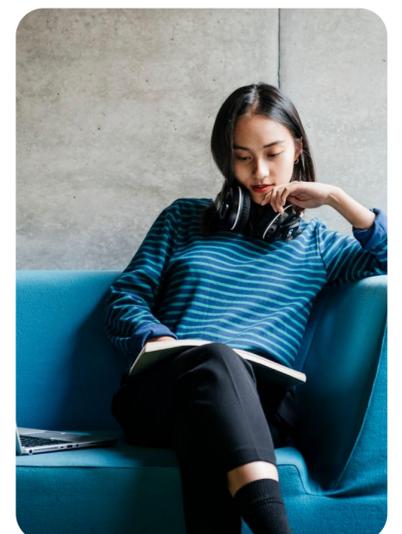


2. Go global with local businesses

Beyond leveraging global media solutions they also harness technology to enable the globalization process e.g. leveraging Gen AI tools to cost effectively build creative in local languages.

Growth Huntr a specialist ecommerce growth agency from Australia has built a dedicated practice helping fashion brands unlock growth from international markets.
